New from you - Admiral Dewey

In the last issue we asked you to send along pictures or articles to include in upcoming issues. Several members have already responded, and we're looking forward to hearing from others. Thanks to **Darrah Artzner** for sending the above article and to **Brian Martin** for sending along pictures of his Admiral Dewey clock, watch and related items.

As a little background to Brian's collection, let's take a quick trip through history to learn more about George Dewey. Many of us remember the name Admiral George Dewey from our high school history studies. After graduating from the Naval Academy in 1858, Dewey began his military career, serving on various ships and moving up the ranks from midshipman to Lieutenant-Commander by the end of the Civil War. During the ensuing years, he served in several posts and in 1896, he was commissioned Commodore, and by the end of 1897, he was involved in preparations for wartime service, and soon after began wartime preparations.

In February of 1898, the USS Maine was sunk, which was one of the precipitating events of the Spanish-American War. Dewey was positioned in the waters off China and swiftly moved to Manila Bay. At the beginning of 1899, Dewey's victory allowed the American troops to land in Manila, which brought an awareness of the United States as a naval power. Dewey returned to America to a hero's welcome and by an act of Congress was made Admiral of the Navy – the only person in the United States to attain this rank, the most senior rank in the United States Navy.


In 1903, the E. Ingraham Company introduced the Dewey model oak kitchen clock. The clock, pictured here in Brian's collection, includes a picture of Dewey pressed into the oak crown. There are several differences between



Brian's clock and many of the Dewey models: The surround is shaped differently and includes different images. The images are repeated in the lower side pieces as well as on the pendulum which can be seen through the lower glass. Most of these clocks have American flags on the crown. Additionally,



the glass is reverse painted with the ship sailing on blue-green waters and the flags being red, gold and blue. The entire painting/stencil is on a black background. The stencil is the usual for this clock, but not the reverse painted feature. Brian said that he has never seen another reverse painted glass like this in a Dewey clock either in person, in a book or in photographs.



To continue the theme of this display, the top shelf displays the clock, along with a small antique kerosene lamp on the left and a small American flag on the right. On the left side of the shelf below is an indigo blue candy dish in the shape of the Battleship Maine. On the right is an 1899 Ingersoll pocket watch featuring Admiral Dewey in the center and officers and politicians of the era in the chapter ring. The back of the case is embossed with Dewey's flagship Olympia. This is a fairly rare watch and it was accompanied by a red and white ribbon and decorative fob. To the right of the shelf is a framed ad for the Ingersoll pocket watch. Both frame and ad are period.



Brian wrote, "I put all of these pieces together over several years. Assembling a related collection like this is part of what makes the hunt interesting for me as I peruse antique malls, shows and auctions."
