Patti Accessories

- -Highly ornamental pendulum with glass insert
- -Gold leaf border on front glass
- -Black label with gold print on back
- -Black flocked paper on the inside of the case
- -A bell mounted to the movement, not the case
- -A 5" dial having 1.5" brass ring
- French style cloverleaf hands





Changes to Patti Movements

In 1885, after the Welch, Spring and company was dissolved, and the manufacturing was taken over completely by the E. N. Welch Manufacturing Company, there were changes in the movement.

The basic changes were:

- Solid pinons instead of lantern pinons.
- 2. Suspension spring in place of a clevis pendulum suspension. (cuckoo type)
- 3. An identification mark of "E. N. Welch Manufacturing Company" stamped on the back plate.
- 4. Gong instead of bell.
