# Chapter 139 Members Earn First Place at the NAWCC National Craft Competition

Members of Chapter 139 were awarded first place in the NAWCC National Craft Competition last month. The project was initiated by Ralph Pokluda and Chris Peck (Chappel Jordan Clock Galleries, Houston, TX), Darrah Artzner, and Mike Stitch. It all began with a visit to the American Watch & Clock Museum in 2009. Ralph Pokluda was visiting the museum and talking with Director Chris Bailey. In the warehouse, collecting dust, was a calendar clock. While it was complete, it was in total disrepair. The dials were badly flaking, and it suffered from a misguided "antiquing" green and pink paint job. Adding to the "colorful" history of the clock was the period where it once resided in a house of ill repute in the Connecticut area. Recognizing a "diamond in the rough," Ralph suggested it be a Chapter 139 restoration project

for the NAWCC Craft Compe-

tition. Chris Peck spearheaded

the project as project manager and advertised for restoration volunteers at the 2009 Houston Regional. Darrah Artzner restored the movement and Mike Stitch took on the daunting challenge of restoring the case to it's original glory. The dial restoration was donated by Martha Smallwood (Dial House).

After winning the competition, the clock now is now at its rightful place on exhibit at the American Watch & Clock Museum in Bristol, Connecticut and along with recognition of the individuals who worked on the project.

Congratulations to these Chapter 139 members for a job well done. They will be recognized at the upcoming All Texas Chapter Regional (August 27, 28, & 29) and receive an award at the Regional Breakfast on Saturday, August 28, 2010.

If you have a clock or watch you're working on, want to have some hands on instruction in repair, or want to ask some experts in clock or watch repair for advice, you need to start coming to our free monthly technical sessions. Earlier in 2010, Chapter 139 began sponsoring free monthly technical sessions on the second Saturday of every month from 8AM until Noon. Many members had requested monthly technical sessions but the effort always fizzled as we did not have the benefit of a regular meeting facility. Tim Glanzman, owner of Turn-Key Coatings, an industrial plating and metal finishing company in Houston, graciously donates

regular meeting space for monthly tech sessions and other chapter activities. Now, Chapter 139 has a new physical home, Previously, meeting space had to be rented or was donated on a temporary basis requiring set-up and tear-down with each use. Now, the Chapter has a facility where we can store equipment and tools, and house a reference library.

Regular hosts at the monthly sessions include Ben Fulbright, Marcus Bush, Del Rolison, Darrah Artzner, and Tim Glanzman. These individuals have also donated tools, equipment, and reference materials to help get the monthly sessions started.

Don Leason is the Education Chairman for Chapter 139 and organizes the NAWCC field suitcase workshops for the Houston area. Don has been


