April Tech Session



Chapter President Drew Lundgren kicked off the meeting with a welcome to the attendees. His greeting follows: Attendance at our last two technical session has been exceptional. Fortunately we all gain from this as we make new friends and somewhere in the room there will be a conversations of interest to anyone. Most conversations relate to clocks and watches, some not. If you haven't been to a Chapter meeting in a while, I recommend that you drop in and share your experiences with others, perhaps learn a few things, or at least eat a doughnut and drink some of Tim's coffee.

The April Tech Session was well attended, and the participants were not disappointed as Shaun Clarke (VP) gave an excellent presentation on "Assessing Pocket Watch

Problems". His points were well taken especially since the value of a pocket watch is clearly dependent on the state of its condition. In case you missed the session, or if you'd like a little refresher, a pdf of his presentation can be found in the EdCtr section of the Chapter website.

In addition to Shaun's presentation, several members received assistance with watch repair questions, including finding a replacement crystal for an early pocket watch.

May Tech Session

Chapter President, Drew Lundgren, opened the Session with a few comments about Regional planning and preparations. Then it was off to the races for Show And Tell. Several members brought in items to share, including a very old wooden cuckoo clock movement. Shaun Clarke brought in a

on a wall since some beauty just gets lost in the minutiae. Many attendees did a close up and personal with this great watch. Be sure to check out this great – working!! – watch in the Silent Auction at next month's Regional!

Ben brought in a Stadimeter (optical device for estimating the range to an object of known height by measuring the angle between the top and bottom of the object). It doesn't record time but just the same is very neat. If Darrah had brought in the surveyor's transit that he restored, the session could have been called a measurement day.

June Tech Session



Although the advertised theme for this session was "Some Interesting and Special Show & Tell, Discussion of Some Techniques, and Help with Clock and Watch Repair Challenges", it could have been statue clock restoration. Drew Lundgren brought in Ben Fulbright's figurine clock for which he restored the base and statue. The clock has yet to be serviced. The amazing before and after pictures are shown here. Drew explained the process and highly recommended the class that Patricia and Jay Holloway conducted several months ago for Chapter members.

Shaun Clarke donated the A&E adaption of Longitude (taken from Dava Sobel's book on John Harrison's quest to build the perfect time keeper) to the Chapter library. Many very interesting Show and Tell items were presented; take a few minutes to check out the pictures in the Tech Sessions section of the Chapter website.

2015 Ward Francillon Time Symposium

This year's Ward Francillon Time Symposium will be held in Houston on October 22-24. The topic is "Mechanical Music & Marvels." Presentations will cover the history and development of clockwork operated devices. The many topics discussed will include historical information, musical clocks, automatons, disc and cylinder music boxes, bird boxes and whistlers, Black Forest clocks, musical clock movements played on bells, early spring operated phonographs and gramophones, and music composed for these devices.

In addition, there will be a panel discussion concerning what to look for or avoid when purchasing a musical mechanism. And as an added bonus, on Saturday there will be tours of two large private collections!

The \$200 pre-registration fee (\$225 after September 19th) includes the Friday evening banquet and Saturday box lunch at one of the homes on the tour, as well as transportation for the tours.
